Are the classrooms equipped with the latest technology? Are there enough units for each child to practice on, or are they expected to share? What about a first-aid unit? What about transportation to and from school? How is that monitored, how is the safety of the children insured?

Who will be my children's teachers? What's the minimum qualifications and experience needed to teach here? What's the teachers' nationality? Are students challenged and encouraged to be academically competitive, creative and reach out of their comfort zone? How? Are teachers competent and up to date with the latest professional development standards specific to their subject? Do teachers get professional developmental support? Are children happy to come to school? Is learning, student-oriented and considers the diversity of cognitive development in each class? Are teachers prepared to reach out to each child according to their individual needs? Is there extra language support for children whose first language is not the language of the school?






MANAGEMENT

Are there policies in place such as anti-bullying or mindfulness which guarantee an inclusive environment of respect, cooperation and compassion How many nationalities are there in the school? Does the management observe their academic staff in order to guarantee maximum teacher competence and effectiveness? What communication strategies are there in place to keep parents on track regarding their children's progress? What about open-doors policies, which would guarantee direct access to management? Does the school advice on choice of university? Does the school accept SEN (special education needs) students? Is there an admission assessment?Are there mandatory vaccines? What's the behaviour policy?

EXPAT SUPPORT

Is there a welcoming board to help new parents integrate into 'the family'? What direct communication methods can parents use to reach their child's teacher and the rest of the school personnel? Are there any opportunities for parents to be directly involved in the school life? How does the school help parents, who might not speak the language of the school/ country they live in? Does the school have a PTA (parents- teachers- association)? Any volunteering charity or work? S there newsletter а to communicateimportant dates and student successes? What should I do to book a place at your school? Is there a digital platform to access in case distance learning was necessary?
